

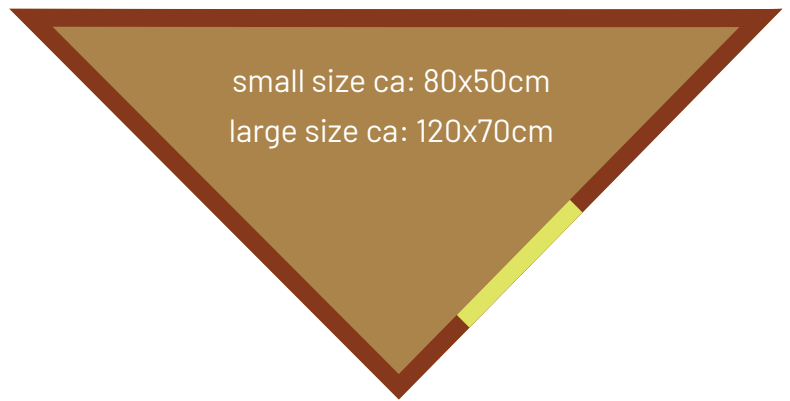
TRIANGLE **BANDANA**



MATERIAL:

- small size: 2,5mm circular needle
- larger size: 3,5mm circular needle
- darning needle

MC: ca. 75g **NICE fine** Cranky Camel
CC1: 10g **NICE fine** in Cookie Crunch
CC2: 5g **NICE fine** in Lazy Lemon



abbreviations:

k	knit		
p	purl	k2togtbl	knit 2 together through back loop
m1R	make one right leaning increase	MC	Main Colour
m1L	make one left leaning increase	CC	Contrast colour
(**)	repeat instructions between the stars		

This bandana is knit flat in stockinette stitch, the 2 coloured iCord is added as a finishing.

With MC, cast on 3 stitches, turn and purl all. Then, work in pattern as follows:

Pattern repeat:

1. Right side: **k1, m1R, k until last stitch, m1L, k1**
2. Wrong side: **purl**
3. Right side: **k1, m1R, k until last stitch, m1L, k1**
4. Wrong side: **p1, m1R, p until last stitch, m1L, p1**

Repeat step 1-4 another 39 times or until desired size.

Change to CC1 and cast on 3 additional stitches to set up for the iCord. Transfer these stitches to the left needle.

Now knit: (***k2, k2togtbl** and transfer the three stitches back to your left needle*). Repeat until you have worked the final live stitch. Leave the three stitches on your right needle.

Continue to work the next side of the triangle:

(*Pick up 1 stitch from the edge and move the iCord stitches back to your left needle. **k2, k2togtbl***). Repeat these steps until you have reached the lower corner of the triangle.

repeat these steps another 19 times, then pick up one more stitch but don't work it. move the iCord stitches back to the left needle. Cut CC1.

Join CC2 and work it as established. Repeat the iCord steps for another 24 stitches in CC2. Pick up one more stitch in CC2 but don't work it. move the iCord stitches back to the left needle. Cut CC2.

Join CC1 again and finish picking up stitches while simultaneously working the iCord edge until to reach the upper corner. Leave the final iCord stitches on the right needle and cut thread, leaving about 10cm end.

With a spare needle, pick up 3 stitches from the cast on edge. Put both needles parallel and graft the stitches together with kitchener stitch.

Block the bandana using a bit of laundry starch to give your new accessory the extra bit of
